Mike Hastings Turners Falls Rod and Gun Club:

 Variance request from 105 CMR 590.009(G)(3) and FC-8-103 (1999 Federal Food Code), pursuant to 590.010 (H)

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The BOH had a wide discussion on this matter in regards to the allergen training issue for the Turners Falls Rod and Gun Club. Mike went through extensive ServSafe training along with another member of the club. This training is extensive and has an exam. He felt that the course covers and educates individuals more extensively than a 30 minute video with no exam or accountability for an additional charge of \$10. Why? It seems redundant and just another way to make money from individuals that basically have already gone through a mandatory training. Jay agreed and saw Mike's side but did not feel the town should carry the liability for the club. Gina had called the State Dept of Public Health and was told it will be the sole responsibility of the local Boards of Health to enforce the allergen certification. The BOH made no decision for a variance. It was suggested that Mike Hastings check with the club to see if they come under Non-Profit 501 c3 status. If so, the allergen training is not required. At 6:45 PM on February 16, 2011 Mike Hastings informed us by phone that the club is a 501 c3. No allergen training will be needed.

2011-2012 Flu Season:

Shortage of money for vaccines.

The State of Massachusetts has cut the amount of state supplied free vaccine it will give to local boards of health. MDPH is also saying we must immunize children first. The flu vaccine costs about .83 each. We see a lot of elderly folks. To make up for a shortage it was suggested that we 1) ask the Senior Center to help pay, 2) Utilize money in the nurse donation fund, 3) Put a warrant on Town Meeting to come up with the approximate \$400.00 needed to purchase vaccine for our elders.
