## **Gill-Montague Regional School District**

Affordable Assessment is \$7,956,781. Request is \$8,012,702.

Mr. Naughton raised the issue that the School Committee has not provided answers to our questions, and has heard that School Committee feels town has not answered their questions, and therefore is in no hurry to answer our questions. Mr. Fairbrother noted that the difference is that they want \$8 million from us, and we aren't asking them for money.

Mr. Naughton is conflicted – the use of stabilization is close to original Table B number, but is concerned that approval now sends the message that we aren't interested in encouraging more reductions in the budget. Mr. Naughton would be more comfortable if the School Committee answered our questions and if they seemed more interested in working with us.

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The Finance Committee decided to postpone this vote in case budget information from Gill-Montague Regional School District changes at tonight's School Committee meeting.

#### **Town Operating Budget**

The Board of Health has requested that the Health Inspector hours be increased from 14.5 to 20 hours per week. No one expressed any objections and Ms. Reynolds stated that she felt the Board of Health made a very strong case for the increase.

The Town Accountant has recommended the following decreases from the requested amounts with the approval of the department heads.

- Decrease the Public Buildings Utilities budget by \$20,000 to reflect historical use of electricity rather than a percent increase on the current year budget. The remaining budget reflects 12 months of actual use with a 5% increase and an additional increase of \$2,000.
- Decrease the Snow and Ice budget by \$13,080. This level funds the Fiscal Year 2013 budget.
- Decrease the Debt budget by \$10,000. Short term interest is budgeted at \$30,000, but with no borrowing in anticipation of bonds planned, \$20,000 is enough.

These reductions are shown in the Recommend column below.

Items not Anticipated – The Attorney General's office has approved the wording of the Finance Committee bylaw amendment. The change will take place after the Town Clerk has posted it for two weeks. The effective date of the change is expected to be April 15, 2013.

Mr. Naughton is willing to follow up with the school district on outstanding issues. He will ask for the final budget assessment as voted tonight, remind them we have not received answers to our questions, and respond to Joyce's comments that we have not

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responded to her questions by requesting that she submit her questions in writing and we will answer them.
