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over. They will gift the cemetery to the Town, along with a modest endowment. This will enable Montague residents to be buried in a more spacious cemetery.

 - We received two new Notices of Noncompliance on September 2 for violating our E. Coli counts and our chlorine. We are required to submit a corrective action plan. Little feels we should purchase a new press.
