# Brian McHugh, FC Regional Housing and Redevelopment Authority Update on Spinner Park Restoration Project

• According to McHugh, the landscape architect still has the plans from 1983, which shows that there are no electrical lines running through the park or the easement, and that the power to the electrical box comes from the pole on 4th Street. This is not the case. Two years ago when the electrical engineer from Berkshire Design and Eversource reviewed the plans that were put together, Eversource okayed the plans, which never mentioned anything about lines running under the park. Also, when the permit was pulled for the demolition of the electrical box and construction of a new box, that also was submitted to Eversource and there was no mention of the lines running under the park. Thus, McHugh feels like everyone did their due diligence.

- We received a verbal proposal from the electrical engineer under the contract of Berkshire Design, and we received a proposal from Berkshire Design and their civil engineer to re-design the electrical lines.
- The current change order is for \$3,500, but it will not be finalized for about two weeks. It needs to be submitted and reviewed by Eversource.
- The hope is to get substantial completion by November, with some things that will probably need to be finished in the spring.

### Police Advisory Review Group Updates & Recommendations Relative to appointments

On the 13th Kuklewicz and Ellis met with a group of residents who will offer a consensus opinion relative to potential members. There will be another meeting on the 20th. Kuklewicz will hopefully have a set of recommendations for the Board on Monday.

### **Town Administrator's Report**

## • FY21 State Budget News

- Ellis shares that we are going to be level funded for FY21. We checked in with contacts at the Department of Revenue as well as the offices of Senator Comerford and Representative Blais, and everyone confirmed that this is a very solid commitment at this point in time.
- There are other components of our Town budget that received State funding, the largest of which is our Chapter 90 funding.
- The State will be getting together again in September to begin trying to finalize the budget.
- Ellis expects we will see a final and comprehensive State budget sometime in mid-to-late October.
- o There is a slightly larger overall budget for Chapter 70, which would benefit our school districts.

### • Turners Falls Power Canal Service Outage, 9/14/2020 to 9/19/20

The Turners Falls Power Canal's drawdown will occur on Monday, September 14th. It will be drained at approximately 7 AM and will remain so until Saturday, December 19th. Ellis stresses that just because it has been dewatered does not mean that it is a safe place to explore and asks that residents please do not attempt to traverse the canal when it is drained down.

### Hazardous Waste Collection Day, 9/26/20

Boutwell reports that there will be a Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, September 26, at GCC in the parking lot; and reviews the information Hazardous Waste registration form. No surveys will be done. The residents will be given appointment times and will do a drive-through collection in which there will be no human contact. Residents can access their website by going under "Your Government," then "Other Local District," then "Franklin County Solid Waste District."
